1. GENERAL INFORMATION

- Turkish citizens holding diplomatic, service, or special passport *do not require* a visa to enter the Norway.
- You cannot normally enter Norway until your application has been processed.
- If you intend to work part-time, you may not begin working until you have received a permit. You cannot work remotely either.
- Some people do not require a visa to visit Norway because they hold a passport from a country with which Norway has a visa exemption agreement. This also applies if you have a residence permit in an EU/EEA country or a special passport:
- Citizens of all EU/EEA countries

3. SHORT TERM VISA APPLICATIONS

- Please go to the home page of the *Directorate of Immigration in Norway* (*UDI*) for Information on application procedures and regulations for short term visits to Norway/Schengen.
- *Checklists* What documents to bring for your visa *application*.
- Applicant who are applying for Tourist Visa and will be staying in any paid
 accommodation while in Norway are requested to download the Travel Questionnaire fill
 it and bring it along with the other documents to apply for the visa <u>click here</u>



4. VISITOR'S VISA

If you plan to visit Norway for up to 90 days, you can apply for a visitor's visa. With this visa you can visit all Schengen countries.

REQUIREMENTS

- You must pay an application fee.
- You must hand in all the documents on the embassy's checklist. You will find the checklist by clicking on the "How to apply" and choosing the country you live in.
- You must have a passport that is valid for at least three months after the end of your visit. The passport must be issued within the last ten years.
- You must have valid travel insurance.
- You must have enough money to finance your stay in Norway and your return journey. You must normally have NOK 500 for each day of your stay in Norway. Alternatively, someone you know, who is living in Norway, can give a financial guarantee.
- You must not be subject to a prohibition against entry to Norway or Schengen.
- If you have been in the <u>Schengen area</u> in the last 90 days, you must check when it is possible for you to re-enter, and how many days you can stay in Schengen. <u>Please use the visa calculator to check this (ec.europa.eu) (external website)</u>
- You must register your fingerprints.
- If you are under the age of 18, both your parents, or other persons responsible for you, must sign your application.
- If you are visiting someone in Norway, you must have an invitation from the person you are visiting.
- You must normally have booked accommodation for the first days of your stay in Norway.



5. STUDY PERMIT

- You must apply for a study permit if you intend to study or attend school in Norway for more than three months. If you are granted a study permit, you will be able to work up to 20 hours per week while studying and full-time during the holidays.

• There are different types of residence permits for people who are going to carry out research or participate in vocational training.

Trainee: For students who are to be trainees in Norway.

Researchers with own funds: For researchers who are to carry out research in Norway, but who do not have a Norwegian employer.


